

Important Dates to Remember

- Common Application deadlines: Varies depending on school some as early as November 1st.
- Early Action College Applications due: December 15th
- Regular Admission College Applications due: January 15th
- Late College Application submission date: February 15th
- College Scholarships deadlines due: Daily
- FAFSA forms due: February 15th
- College decision and Deposit due: May 1st
- To get the most out of scholarship opportunities you should apply for one scholarship per week

Important Questions to Ask

What is the placement rate for the desired major not just the placement rate for the college?

How active is the alumna in the college especially in internship placements, scholarships, and job opportunities?

Is it the student's responsibility to locate any of the required internships or does the college take care of the placements?

What are those things that I have to have in a college and the college setting that will help me feel safe, committed to the responsibilities of the academic program, and enhance the college experience opportunities?

How will the college experience help me answer the key questions: Who Am I? What kind of life do I want to Lead? and How do I achieve it?

What is the retention rate for returning Freshmen?

What is the percentage of students that graduate in the traditional 4 years?

Check List of things to do to prepare for college

- SAT/ACT Testing
- Toured at least 3 colleges to see the differences that make colleges unique
- Student copy of Transcript with GPA and Class Rank
- SUNY Part I Applications completed by November 1st
- Common Application completed by November 1st
- Completed at least 100 hours of Community Service to be eligible for scholarship opportunities
- Resume
- Athletic/Artist Profile
- Portfolio
- Scholarship Database Registration completed
- Complete one scholarship application per week
- Letters of Recommendation due November 1st
- College Essay
- Independent College Applications due between December 15th and February 15th
- FAFSA (Federal Application for Financial Aid) Due: February 15th
